

How to get concert tickets

Single tickets for individual concerts are sold through our regular Box Office at Snider's Pharmacy on Champlain Street in Deep River, starting two weeks before each concert. Tickets are also sold at the door on concert night.

A series subscription provides a reserved seat at all four concerts, and a saving of up to 60% on regular ticket prices. Special rates are offered for students and seniors and for families.
